- 1. Noble Master in each that shows incredible grace
- 2. Corrupt son/manager in each that wastes Masters resources
- 3. Wayward son/mgr. faces a moment of truth
- 4. Wayward son/mgr. both throw themselves at mercy of Master
- 5. Both deal with broken trust & its consequences

Subject is God, hardness of heart, and grace – NOT MONEY
