

4 times = "And everyone did what was right in their own eyes"

- 1) 12 Tribes
- 2) Working mostly independently
- 3) With no real Leader
- 4) They are dispersed

Act 2 Building a Nation

Timeline:

- Adam Noah = roughly 1000 yrs.
- Noah Abraham = roughly 1000 yrs.
- Abraham, Isaac, Jacob & 12 sons = roughly 250
- Egypt = roughly 400 yrs.
- Getting to Sinai = 3 months
- Receiving Torah = 1 yr.
- Edge of the Land = turn 11 days into 40 years
- Conquering the Land = 70 yrs.





Repairing the Kingdom

Key Dates:

- 722 BC = Israel in North Falls to Assyria
 - Hosea, Amos, Isaiah, Micah, Nahum, Zephaniah, Obadiah
- 612 BC = Assyria Falls to Babylon
- 587/586 BC = Judah Falls to Babylon
 - Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, Esther, Hab.
- 70 years = Babylon Falls to Persia, Remnant returns to Promised Land
 - Ezra, Nehemiah, Haggai, Zechariah, Jonah, Malachi

3 Stages with Isaiah, Jeremiah, & Ezekiel

- 1. Isaiah Anticipation OF the Exile
- 2. Jeremiah Transition INTO Exile
- 3. Ezekiel Participation IN Exile

II Isaiah

- I. Israel is God's servant
 - Isaiah 42:6-7
- II. But Israel is the broken reed
 - Isaiah 42:18-20, 23-25
 - Isaiah 44:24, 28
- III. God will bring Another Servant on Israel's behalf
 - Isaiah 49:1-6

II Isaiah - The Suffering Servant

- Israel is to be God's people & ultimately a Light to the Gentiles
- Israel as a Nation Fails
- Over & over Faithful Individuals try to do it FOR Israel AS AN Israelite but they cannot
- Now One is coming along to do it To BE Faithful Israel FOR Israel and as a light to the Gentiles

- 538 BC = First Return
- 516 BC = Temple Restored
- 458 BC = Ezra the Priest returns
- 445 BC = Nehemiah returns & rebuilds walls
- 432 BC = Nehemiah's reforms
- 333 BC = Greece gains control over Israel

Preparing for Messiah

Eventually Rome takes over around 64 BC

- · People are suffering & disillusioned
- Wicked foreigners have come into their country with hatred in their eyes and weapons in their hands
- Outside domination has gone on for roughly 800 years...the Assyrians, the Babylonians, the Medes and Persians, the Greeks, the Romans
- And yet behind all this there is a hope...that God is alive and that He will make good on His Story, on His promises...EXPECTANT WAITING

Act 5 Preparing for Messiah

John 1:1-5, 14, 18

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being. In Him was life, and the life was the Light of men. The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.

And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

No one has seen God at any time; the only begotten God who is in the bosom of the Father, He has explained Him."

- He would link the Great Prophet Moses with the Greater Prophet to come
- He would link the covenant with Abraham with the fulfillment of Messiah an Israelite on Israel's behalf
- He would link the Kingship of David with the TRUE INTENDED MESSIANIC KING

I. Existence of the Jewish People

Mark Twain:

"...If statistics are right, the Jews constitute but one percent of the human race. It suggests a nebulous dim puff of stardust lost in the blaze of the Milky way. Properly, the Jew ought hardly to be heard of, but he is heard of, has always been heard of. He is as prominent on the planet as any other people, and his commercial importance is extravagantly out of proportion to the smallness of his bulk.

The Egyptian, the Babylonian, and the Persian rose, filled the planet with sound and splendor, then faded to dream-stuff and passed away; the Greek and the Roman followed; and made a vast noise, and they are gone; other people have sprung up and held their torch high for a time, but it burned out, and they sit in twilight now, or have vanished. The Jew saw them all, beat them all, and is now what he always was, exhibiting no decadence, no infirmities of age, no weakening of his parts, no slowing of his energies, no dulling of his alert and aggressive mind. All things are mortal but the Jew; all other forces pass, but he remains. What is the secret of his immortality?"

III. The Messianic Kingdom

Hebrews 9:24-28 "For Christ did not enter a holy place made with hands, a *mere* copy of the true one, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us; nor was it that He would offer Himself often, as the high priest enters the holy place year by year with blood that is not his own. Otherwise, He would have needed to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now once at the consummation of the ages *Jesus* has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself.

And inasmuch as it is appointed for men to die once and after this *comes* judgment, so Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many..."
