Stephen has several options:

- 1. He can defend himself
- 2. He can just speak of the realities of Jesus
- *3. Instead Stephen decides to give them the BIG Story picture*

Stephen will address 3 audiences:

1. The Diaspora Jews

2. The Jerusalem Leadership

3. Luke's audience that needs shoring up in their faith

Stephen addresses the 3 great pillars of the Jewish people:

1. Land

2. Law

3. Temple

I. The Foundational Promises to Abraham (Chapter 7:2-8)

The Acts of the Apostles II. Rejected Joseph & salvation of God's People (Chapter 7:9-16)

Stephen's goal is obvious

- Joseph was rejected by his brothers, the very patriarchs of Israel BTW
- God then vindicates the rejected Joseph by saving Israel through him
- Joseph's very rejection was God's divine means of saving His people
- Sounds a lot like Stephen! Sounds even more like Jesus!!!

The Acts of the Apostles Review:

- 1. God is not confined to the Promised Land & in particular the Temple
- 2. There is a pattern of rejecting God's appointed people and then of God utilizing the rejected servant to aide His people
- *3. Stephen signed up for one thing & yet now finds himself being used for another*
