Review:

- 1. Paul gets called by Jesus to Jerusalem, Spirit tells friends he will suffer
- 2. On arrival James & the church have a plan
- 3. Jewish Leadership seize & accuse him of taking a Gentile in the Temple
- 4. Roman cohort rushes down & saves him

Review:


- 5. Roman Commander allows Paul to speak
- 6. Speech goes well until Paul ends with his calling from God to preach to the Gentiles
- 7. Turns into a near riot, commander removes him to scourge him
- 8. Paul shares he is a Roman citizen. Brought back to the Sanhedrin

Review:

- 9. Paul's words split them down the middle
- 10. Roman commander saves him again, assigns ½ cohort to take him to Caesarea fleeing the 40 assassins
