Scene 6 – The Giving of the Torah

- Exodus 19:1-6, 7-8

Moses went up to God, and the LORD called to him from the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob and tell the sons of Israel:

'You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and *how* I bore you on eagles' wings, and brought you to Myself.

'Now then, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be My own possession among all the peoples, for all the earth is Mine; and you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.'



Numbers = Wandering

Deuteronomy = deuterio = 2nd reading / nomos = law

Building a Nation

Timeline:

- Adam – Noah = roughly 1000 yrs.
 - Noah – Abraham = roughly 1000 yrs.
 - Abraham, Isaac, Jacob & 12 sons = roughly 250
 - Egypt = roughly 400 yrs.
 - Getting to Sinai = 3 months
 - Receiving Torah = 1 yr.
 - Edge of the Land = turn 11 days into 40 years
 - Conquering the Land = 70 yrs.

Joshua 1:1-2

The name Joshua (Yehoshua) means Yahweh is salvation

His original name, Hosea, was given to him at birth while he was in Egypt meaning "salvation"

II Cor. 4:8-11

[8] We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; [9] persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; [10] always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. [11] For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh.
