1. Jesus' Genesis – Matt. 1:1

Col. 1:15 He (Jesus) is the image of the invisible God, the <u>firstborn</u> of all creation. [16] For <u>by</u> Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created <u>through</u> Him and <u>for</u> Him. [17] And He is <u>before all things</u>, and in Him all things hold together.

2. Jesus' fulfillment – Matt. 1:1

<u>His Plan</u>:

- a) Select a man (Abraham), transform him into a Jew, build this 1 man into a Nation, and then eventually save the world thru this Nation
- b) The Nation despite God's efforts refuses to cooperate with God to make this happen (for millennia)
- So what does the Father do?
- c) He sends His Son, births Him thru the lineage of Israel, as a Jew...fulfilling God's original saving promise to save the world thru Israel by doing it Himself

I Sam. 7:12 When your days (David) are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish His kingdom. [13] He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish the throne of His kingdom forever.

- a) Gender outsiders = women
- *b)* Racial outsiders = mostly non-Jews
- *c) Moral outsiders* = *Prostitutes, incestuous ancestry*

General observations:

Hebrews 4:15-16 For we do not have a High Priest (Jesus) who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. [16] Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Closing thoughts:
