- Proverbial use
- Frequently used to describe anything that is small in its beginning
- Used often by Rabbis in teaching

What is Jesus' point?

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Matthew 13:31-33

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- 1. Jesus didn't look that impressive. (Isa.53)
- 2. Much of what Jesus did didn't look all that impressive.
 - → The Kingdom of God begins with the birth, life, an crucifixion of Jesus. Unimpressive to the untrained eye...
