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"Twisted" = to distort - twisting God meaning both our perception of God & thus our interaction with God into Something both He & it is not



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Phil. 2:14 Do all things without grumbling or questioning, [15] that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted (same word) generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world

Math. 10:1 And He called to Him His twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every affliction.

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Even though:

- >God never promised us so much of what we are expecting
- >God has made it clear life is dark & broken, Satan runs this world for now, & everyone has free choice & with all of that placed in a blender we have the mayhem of life that we experience
- >This works both ways

Thinking God isn't coming thru with blessing because He is wrathful Thinking when we fail or sin & then we expect bad Christian karma

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Point = It's not about what you <u>accomplish</u> it's about who you <u>partner</u> with

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<u>Prov. 30:8-9</u> Remove far from me falsehood and lying; give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with the food that is needful for me, [9] lest I be full and deny you and say, "Who is the LORD?" or lest I be poor and steal and profane the name of my God.

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Point = It's not about what you accomplish it's about who you partner with

➤ So much of our frustration is we WANT some THING

<u>I Cor. 13:2</u> And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have <u>all faith, so as to remove mountains</u>, but have not love, I am nothing.

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<u>II Sam. 12:20</u> Then David arose from the earth and washed and anointed himself and changed his clothes. And he went into the house of the LORD and worshiped.

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Il Cor. 12:8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me.
