The NT presents a paradox on the coming of the Kingdom of God:

1)The Kingdom <u>HAS COME</u> in Jesus and yet it is still <u>IN THE FUTURE</u> 2)The Gospels also announce the Kingdom is <u>NEAR</u> and yet <u>FAR OFF</u> 3)And still Jesus' followers will <u>NEVER KNOW THE TIMING</u> of the Kingdom come and yet <u>HERE ARE THE SIGNS</u>

It doesn't feel like pressure because ultimately they know 2 things:

They have faith the Master will return victorious with Power & Authority as THEIR rightful King
The Master's gifts will produce the results

I Cor. 3:6-8 I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth. So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth. Now he who plants and he who waters are one; but each will receive his own reward according to his own <u>labor</u> (NOT WHAT HE PRODUCES). For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building.
