...that Messiah died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures

Greek = sin = hamartia = missing the mark

Ultimately you cannot reflect the trinity if you are not:

- Connected to God
- Connected to each other
- Reflecting the praises of creation back to the Creator & in turn reflecting the Creator's wise & loving care back into the world


In Exodus 19 Israel was called to be God's royal priesthood:

- Worship God (just stay in recognition that He was God & nothing else is)
- Reflect His rescuing wisdom & love into the world



But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for His Own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him Who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light.

I Peter 2:9



We were literally designed to reflect the majesty & wisdom & love of God:

- Back to Him so we remember who is God & who is not
- To all of creation through our dominion over creation

 We turn the power of the Divine (who is the only One who will handle that power well) over to a thief, an idol whose only purpose it is to destroy & that is what we see in the world today


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- Which produces death/exile just lifelessness & struggle & toil & bodies that break down over time & a world that works against us

The forgiveness of sins in the OT meant several things all at once:

- Rescue from exile & slavery
- The return of God's Presence
- The conquering of the dark forces by removing their power that we by the way handed them

In the life of Jesus God moves to dwell amongst us again as it was in the garden




And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.
