
Some key perspectives & approaches

I. Paul had an honesty about what he was going through


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
II. Paul had a deep sense of his worth to God



& look how it ended... Not in defeat, not with an ending but rather in victory & a beginning




Paul saw his life of struggle as a walking out the road to Calvary




Here is the next step to Paul's explanation... Just as Paul saw his life of struggle as a

walking out the road to Calvary So Paul sees his life of unsettledness & adversity as walking out the resurrection

Paul travels to Colossae

Paul presses further up to Macedonia

 - a) Unrest = Paul still doesn't have finality
 - Adversity = Paul has opposition both to his message and his calling

- II. How do you overcome unrest & adversity without closure?
 - a) Paul recognizes his place in the "royal procession" = Messianic Suffering

Messianic Suffering = What is in large part true of Messiah is true of His people
